News about: The October 2019 Parent Survey from the Governing Board

Last term the Governors asked Parents to take part in a survey and we are delighted to report that it showed perceptions of the school in a very positive light.

The majority (99%) agreed or strongly agreed that their child was happy at the school. The majority also thought their children felt safe at the school and 96% of parents who completed the survey said they would recommend the school to another parent.

There were some responses which have prompted the school to further improve their behaviour and relationship procedures. These improvements include the introduction of CARE cards and CARE cabin which encourage pupils to reflect on their behaviour and complete restorative actions. The school have also increased the range of lunchtime clubs available and are currently reviewing staffing at playtimes and lunchtimes, in order to ensure that all parts of the school day are accessible and enjoyable for all children.
