They will be bringing home the class 'Herdy' and we will be inviting their parents to share our Shine Celebration on Friday 28th February at 2:40pm.


### News from: The Head's Office

Today is the first edition of: '**St Andrew's Shining Stories**' section in our newsletter.


A review of 'In the Fifth at Malory Towers' - Enid Blyton

The best character is Darrell Rivers because she writes the play in the story.




A review of 'Gangsta Granny' - David Williams

I would recommend this book to others because it is very exciting and makes you want to read on.




A review of 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' - Onjali Q Rauf


#### Adult book recommendation- for half term
