Zones of regulation

The Zones of Regulation is a whole school approach to supporting emotional regulation and pupil wellbeing, that is used in both the Infant and Junior Schools.

All pupils at the school will be familiar with the resource below, and the language of the 'Zones' which we use to help children to talk about their feelings.

We thought it would be helpful for us to share these resources with you, at home, to support you in having conversations with your children about their feelings, and to support them in regulating their feelings.

You can find a PDF version of this resource, as well as a brief overview of the 'zones of regulation' and a glossary of terms on the school website;

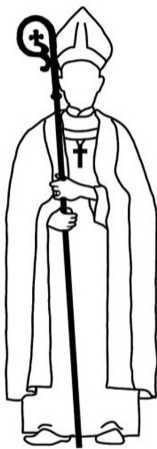
