Herdys will NOT be coming home with the child who has been awarded the SHINE AWARD, but will sit on their desk in school instead!






PE safety reminder

Welcome to a new weekly feature; this week it is the turn of year 5.


SPOTLIGHT ON YEAR FOUR! Maple and Oak Base

This week, we have been reading the book, The Arrival by Shaun Tan and writing descriptive poems and stories using the images of the book to inspire us. This book contains only images - no words, so we have used lots of class discussion to generate ideas about the story. The man in the story sets off on a journey to a strange land, leaving his wife and daughter behind. We started by linking our Compassion, Achieve, Respect, Enjoy values to the story and thought about the effect the man leaving would have on his family. We then looked at the images and selected nouns, verbs and adverbs for effect to write a poem. The children wrote some beautiful poems and really thought about how they could include our school values.

In Science, we have been learning about forces. We made three different parachutes using paper and string and explored their air resistance by dropping them from the same height. Then, we looked at water resistance and made three different shapes out of blu-tac. We dropped them into a huge tub of water and measured how long they took to hit the bottom of the tub. This was all very exciting and a fun way to learn about science!

Well done Year 5 for a great start back at school!

To put your mind at rest —the meals provided by the school are served in takeaway bags and boxes . The catering staff wear gloves when handling the food or packaging. The meals are collected and delivered to the classroom by staff allocated to each bubble. All the children eat their meals at their own desk regardless of whether they have bought in a lunch from home or have a meal supplied by the school. The desks are cleaned with anti bacterial spray both before and after lunch and all children and staff wash their hands thoroughly. Please be assured that there is no increased risk to your child by choosing to support the school and purchase a school lunch.
