

Spotlight on Year Five



Year 5 nave naa an exciting few weeks across the curriculum. In PE lessons they are having coaching from a cricket coach and learning how to do orienteering. Mrs Briggs was once part of the Great Britain youth orienteering squad so she has been showing the children photos and videos of her competing. The children were excited to learn how to follow courses on a map and have been competing in races against each other. Lots of the children have shown an interest in experiencing orienteering in the local area and showing their families how to use a map! East Hanningfield Reservoir, Great Notley Country Park, High Lodge (Thetford), High Woods Country Park, Hylands Park and Tiptree Heath.









The children have also been learning about the USA and have been on a virtual road trip around some of the states. They have loved looking at skyscrapers, bridges and natural wonders; listening to music from USA musicians; learning about Native Americans and exploring Orlando. They will be working together in groups over the next few weeks to design and build their own bridge based on some of the famous bridges from across the USA. Last week, we used sheets of paper to make a bridge with a 15cm span and tested their structures using packs of post-it notes. They are also very excited about their Independence Day party on the 5th July! We can't wait to celebrate this amazing topic that we have all really enjoyed exploring.
