We are aware that the Infant School use Studybugs to report absence but this facility is NOT used here at the Juniors. Apologies for any inconvenience this may cause.



### PLACES KIDS CAN EAT FOR FREE DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

Asda - children can eat free after 3pm Monday to Friday, and you can get a free Ella's Kitchen baby food pouch for children under 18 months with any purchase.
