# Spotlight on Year 5 – Greenwich Royal Observatory Trip



On Wednesday 28th September, Year 5 went to London to visit the Greenwich Royal Observatory. The children have written about what they got up to...

The best thing about the Royal Observatory is the planetarium. When you enter the planetarium, you will see hundreds of seats. When you get in those seats, you will lean back and the show will begin! Jasmine

We got to choose which planets we wanted to see. They came spinning closer from the solar system. Our class chose Saturn and Mars. Saturn has lots of rings and it's biggest moon is called Titan. *Holly* 

In the show, you get to learn about two planets that your class votes for. We picked Mars and Saturn. We learnt that Mars is very small because when the planets were made, Jupiter captured more rocks and metals from the atmosphere and stole them from Mars! *George*

We also did a workshop with an astronomer about the phases of the moon. We learnt that the diameter of the moon is 3,764km. We only ever see one side of the moon because the moon spins at the same speed as Earth. *Joshua* 

Our astronomer Jess told us that Saturn has 83 moons! Logan



You can stand on the prime meridian line! It is 0 degrees longitude and goes through London. We also saw the whole London skyline. *Fli C* 

The prime meridian is actually an imaginary line from the North pole, through London to the South pole but the Royal Observatory have drawn its location on the ground. It splits the world into the East and West hemispheres. *Gayathri* 

I think it was one of the best trips ever because we got to see the Great Equatorial telescope and learn more about the moon.

Unfortunately entrances submitted after the deadline will not be accepted.

I appreciate how busy the school schedule for this term will be but hope that your pupils are able to participate in what should be an exciting and creative Christmas competition this year. Pupils are also welcomed to enter individually from home should this be difficult for schools to accommodate but they are reminded to ensure all relevant information to be included at the back of their entry.
