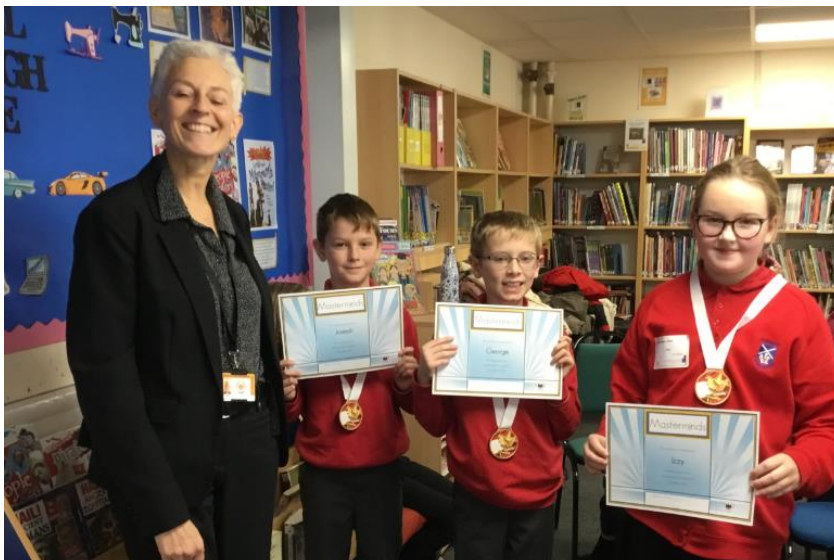
Spotlight on the GBHS Year Five Mastermind contest 2022



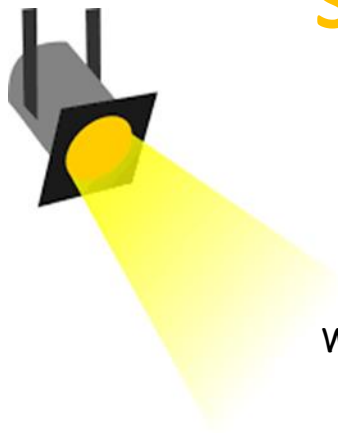

ESSEX LIBRARIES WINTER READING CHALLENGE: This year's challenge is all about the journey of Lyra the penguin. Challengers will help Lyra as she travels around the zoo, asking her animal friends all about how they celebrate the winter season differently around the world. The children have 6 challenges they can choose from and each time they complete a challenge they will collect a stamp on their Winter Reading Challenge leaflet. Examples of challenges include: read a book with a blue cover, read a book by a new author, read your book to one of your toys or pets, create a Lego character or scene inspired by your book, make a picture inspired by your book, use Britannica Junior to find an interesting fact about one of our animal friends, write a short story or poem inspired by your book etc. There are challenges for all ages and reading abilities.

Once the 6 challenges have been completed (the children can bring in evidence or can simply tell us about what they have done) they will earn a packet of seeds to plant next year, and, while stocks last, we have free books to give away, which have been donated by Penguin books! The challenge runs from Saturday 26 November to Saturday 28 January.

If the children choose to complete one of the written challenges, such as create a comic strip, or write a short story or poem, they can also enter our Year of Reading competition which is on the Essex Libraries website. Entries can range from zero (picture books) up to 1000 words. An independent panel will judge each piece of work in the relevant age category. Shortlisted entrants will receive a certificate and see their work published on the free Essex Year of Reading App. We will also publish a selection of entries in a new Essex Year of Reading book which will be available next year. The winner will receive a £100 book token
