Re: Spring term parent consultation appointments

Dear Parents and Carers.

We are very pleased to be able to invite you into school for a parent consultation appointment this term. On Tuesday 7^{th} February and Thursday 9^{th} February, between 3.30pm and 6.30pm we will be holding consultation appointments.

We are planning to hold face-to -face appointments this term; these will be held in classrooms. If you are unable to attend in person, we will also be offering the option of a phone call.

We are allowing <u>one appointment</u> per child, so we ask that you liaise between yourselves if you and your child's other parent do not live together. In some situations we will provide an equivalent length phone call on another day- but requests for this are to be made to Mrs Black via email - <u>admin@hatfieldpevereljun.essex.sch.uk</u>

The arrangements are as follows:

- •Please arrive via the main school reception, where you will be signed in and directed to your child's base.
- •You will have an opportunity to look through their books which will be on display in one of the year group bases.
- •The consultations will take place in the opposite base where appointments will be 8 minutes long.

If it is clear a longer appointment is needed, the class teacher will invite you to continue the discussion at another time. Please allow time to get to any siblings appointments when booking.

If your child is on the SEND register, One Plan meetings will be taking place during the week beginning 27^{th} February and letters confirming your child's appointment will be sent out soon. An updated copy of your child's One Plan will be emailed out to you following the meeting.



Spotlight on Year 3

Exciting News from Year 3!

On Thursday, Year 3 enjoyed an Ancient Egyptian day. Everyone came to school in Ancient Egyptian costumes with lots of Cleopatras and Tutankhamums!

First, they mummified a banana - after eating the banana they then filled the empty skin with Natron (salt and bicarbonate of soda) and used their sewing skills to sew it up. They left it covered in natron to mummify! (sorry but you have got these to finish the mummifying process at home!)

Spotlight on Year 3

In the afternoon, the children learnt a bit of Ancient Egyptian maths. They learnt that numbers 1 - 9 are just a vertical line and that 10 is represented as an arch, a coil of rope is 100, and a lotus flower is 1,000.

After maths, the children began to add the armature (a framework) to their canopic jars. They used empty pringle tubes and created the head of one of the gods (Imsety -human headed god, Hapi -baboon headed god, Duamutef - jackal headed god and Qebehsenuef - falcon headed god.) They used rolled up newspaper to create the head shape and covered it with masking tape and added appendages to create ears, noses, eyes or head dresses.


After break the children got to try some different foods that Ancient Egyptians would have had in their diet such as flat bread, olives, figs, dates and honey.
