### **Spotlight on the Year 5 History Day**

On Wednesday, Year 5 had a visit from 'History Off the Page' which linked to our history topic about the Vikings.



The purpose of the morning session was to give the children an understanding of the lives lived by those in Britain in the year 878 AD through practical activities and role play.

After a brief introduction to start the narrative, the children spent the morning in character exploring the different work

stations set up within the hall. The activities included:

- Visiting the wise woman to get a potion for an illness
- Bracelet and weaving
- · Candle making
- · Clay figurines of Viking gods
- Necklace making
- Illuminated letters
- · Making their own ink for writing with a quill
- Clay pots
- · Making a pouch and clay runes

Some children even took on Lord Ulf (Patrick, our leader for the day) in a strategic game of Hnefatafl game - pronounced as nef-ah-tah-fel. He was very impressed with how quickly the children picked up the rules of the

game. Mrs Briggs enjoyed it so much that she ordered a game for the children to play in school next week!

In the afternoon, the children were taught how to use a shield to protect themselves against the enemy - an activity they all thoroughly enjoyed.









### Spotlight on the Year 5 History

The children then travelled forward to the present day. The location stayed the same, our village from the morning, but the time period was different. The children took on the roles of archaeologists and used their reasoning skills to discover the different areas of our village.

### Spotlight on the School Council

#### School Council

This term, the school council has been working extremely hard on applying for a green flag and Eco Schools status. This is an accreditation offered by Keep Britain Tidy. Dedicated councillors have been giving up their Tuesday lunchtimes to work through an environmental review of the school.

Actions taken so far to reduce our negative impact on the planet:

- Poster competition to encourage everyone to turn lights off
- Meeting set up with our waste company to find out how to improve recycling
- Planning fundraising to buy bird feeders and bird food
  - Meeting with Mrs Dutaut to plan a container pond for the outdoor classroom
    - ★ Planning an electricity free day

We also took part in the RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch: on the afternoon of Friday 3rd February councillors spent an hour under the gazebo and in Willow Base counting how many different bird species we could see. We came to the conclusion that we need to provide more nesting and feeding places in order to make our school grounds more bird friendly.







#### **Spotlight on History**

At St. Andrew's, history is a subject that is loved by all children and teachers; and is where we see lots of creativity and the opportunity for all to shine. We encourage children to study topics and historical concepts in depth and to become *historians* as they are immersed with opportunities to learn, explore and present information in a range of ways.

Children show our core CARE values as they learn about the lives of people in the past, showing compassion for societies and civilisations that have been through challenging times and learn to show respect for a range of different cultures, beliefs and communities. They enjoy learning facts and remembering the chronology of events both in British history and worldwide, and can achieve the skills that will set them up to methodically analyse historical evidence and answer enquiry questions about the past.

This half term has seen the children of St Andrew's enjoy learning a range of topics: Year 3 have studied the Egyptians, Year 4 the Romans, Year 5 the Vikings and, earlier in the autumn term, Year 6 explored Cause and Consequence through looking at the devastation and changes brought by World War One, linking to their focus English novel, War Horse.

#### Visits and experience days.

Through the school, history topics are brought to life through hands-on, exciting activities, and even whole days, that allow children to learn like real historians. Children have experienced a range of practical activities such as examining artefacts, trying food of the time period, practising battle tactics or important rituals (like mummification) and some have even dressed up for the day!



#### Year 3 Egyptian day







Burial process - mummification of a banana, exploring the Egyptian number system, creating canopic jars.





#### Year 4 Roman day







Meeting a roman centurion, trying out camp activities and wearing heavy armour.





Exploring Roman artefacts, and learning to march with Latin commands!



#### Year 5 Viking Day









Archeological digging, using natural sources to make ink and write, making clay runes and Viking shield practise.

#### Year 6 Letter from the trenches and Trench Cake!

Year six have enjoyed learning about World War One, one highlight was trying the real recipe for trench cake. They were extremely lucky (and grateful) that Sophie had an actual letter sent home from the trenches for them all to examine closely and use as an example to write their own letters home!










#### Cross curricular learning

Year 3 Egyptian diary entries (they have been to the Pharaoh's party!) and canopic jars:










#### ParentPay - our new online payment service

Our <u>current</u> online payment provider (Pay360 Education Payments) has presented a number of difficulties to several families with some still unable to register and take advantage of online payment with us. We are therefore pleased to announce that from 1<sup>st</sup> April we will be accepting payments online with an alternative provider - ParentPay - for items such as dinner money, school trips and clubs. Using this secure <u>website</u> you will be able to pay online using your credit / debit card. <u>ParentPay</u> will be our preferred method of making payments to school - from 31<sup>st</sup> March you will no longer be able to use Pay360 Education Payments to make online payments to our school.


