Meals are £2.50 daily and can be ordered by your child in class during registration each morning.





Spotlight on French at St Andrew's.



On Thursday, we welcomed Madame Morandeau to St. Andrew's. Madame Morandeau teaches English at a French school in the Vendée, France. Several years ago, we were fortunate enough to forge links with this school (École St. Elme). The children in Year 6 annually send correspondence to pupils abroad of a similar age. Bringing a native speaker into the school this week allowed our children to enjoy the rare opportunity to ask questions about life in a French school and hear the French language be fluently spoken. Madame Morandeau was keen to share similarities and differences between our two schools. During her visit, she showed our Year 6 classes a video about life in their French school. The presentation included messages from our French pen pals, clips of class activities and a feel for life as a French student.





At St. Andrew's we aim to offer an exciting MFL curriculum which inspires our children to become lifelong language learners. Children learn French in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 on a rotational basis, allowing them to experience equal coverage of the four key skill areas: listening, speaking, writing and reading. Our main objective is to provide our pupils with a confidence and grounding that will prepare them for language-learning at secondary school, and potentially beyond. Each topic within the French curriculum is progressive and ultimately builds up to Year 6 where the children write letters to our partner school incorporating all topics that have been learnt since Year 3.
