

Florence has been playing football for a few months now and gaining confidence each week - her family have never seen her so happy! She got player of the match this week and wanted to share a picture with us all.


Well done Florence, it's lovely to see you shining!

Spotlight on Outdoor Learning

Year 3 have been spending Wednesday afternoons in our Outdoor Classroom with Mrs Dutaut and our gardening volunteer John Clemo. They have been learning all about weaving.




John brought in some Willow whips (thin shoots) for the children to learn the traditional art of Willow weaving. The children have been working on a Willow obelisk which will be used to grow climbing plants, and a Willow fence.







With Mrs Dutaut, the children have been learning about the practical uses of Willow (it's a natural pain killer!), about traditional weaving techniques and the objects that are made by weaving (including Coracle woven boats), and superstitions and myths related to Willow. The children learned the Japanese fable of Green Willow and made model Japanese gardens.





The children have also been trying out weaving in a range of materials (natural materials, wool and paper), as well as the usual forest favourites: mud kitchen and bug hunting!

Mrs Dutaut has been studying Outdoor Learning over the past year, and was pleased to hear that she has passed the Level 3 Learning Beyond the Classroom qualification this week!
