Essex Libraries have teamed up with the Moshi App. The app provides hundreds of audio stories, guided meditations, music and much more, that will help your child sleep better, regulate their emotions and encourage their imagination grow. The best part of the libraries partnership with the app is that access to the app is free and signing up is quick and easy.

Parents have reported that their children are falling asleep twenty-eight minutes faster than before and stay asleep for twenty-two minutes longer, after use of the app.

Families with children who have special educational needs say that using the app has improved their child's routine and wellbeing when it comes to big transitions and regulating their emotions.

Although the audience for the app is aimed at ages 0-10, older children have been using the app for sleep and homework, reporting better concentration and quality of sleep.

The app is split into five sections, stories, moments, music, sounds and mediations. Each part is represented by a different Moshi character, making the app engaging and fun to children. Want to learn more about the different characters? watch our child friendly video <u>here</u>.

As part of your subscription, you will have unlimited access to the Moshi app. After 30 days of access, you will need to log back into your account to continue accessing Moshi's features, still for free.
