


Art

Year 4 have been working carefully to design and create their own Anglo Saxon crosses. We studied crosses and patterns carefully to sketch our designs. Next we made the crosses out of cardboard and added 3D embellishments. Finally, we covered the crosses with PVA glue and kitchen towel to make them sturdy and stone-like. After half term, we are going to paint them with acrylic paint and decorate the crosses with gold and silver paint pens.
