These are the children who have been spotted shining in school this week. We could have chosen so many children- the decisions were hard to make!



Verity was recently staying with her Grandparents at their home where her Grandad is currently very poorly. Whilst in the living room, her Grandad became very unwell, collapsed and became unconscious. Her grandmother was upstairs so she was in the living room on her own with him. Verity kept very calm, but was clearly affected and upset by what she saw. She noticed he had become unwell and took immediate action by running upstairs shouting 'Grandma, Grandad needs you'....

Because of her quick thinking, her Grandma was able to bring Grandad back to consciousness and call an ambulance. When the ambulance arrived, they praised Verity for her quick thinking and action taking. She even got to help them put the pads on for the ECG. Her Grandad was taken to hospital where he remained for a week before being discharged.

Verity was naturally very upset and shaken by the incident which has resulted in lots and lots of cuddles and talking with her family. They are also reminding her how much of a hero she is! We think so too Verity - your family are, quite rightly, very proud of you and so are we! You have shone very brightly in helping your Grandad.

Priti Patel's Christmas Card Competition

Priti Patel's Christmas Card Competition has been extended until 13th November 2023 to ensure that all schools have enough time to submit their entries.

As a reminder, the theme for the Christmas Cards this year is 'Festive Fun' and all submissions should be sent to **Priti Patel MP**, **House of Commons**, **Westminster**, **London SW1A OAA**. The competition is open to children up to the age of 13 years old.

All entries must be able to be reproduced using standard four colour process - no cotton or glitter - and must not be larger than A4. Please don't submit any folded entries and ensure the artist's name, age and school is clearly marked on the back of each entry.

The winner and runner ups will be announced shortly after the deadline. Priti is looking forward to congratulating the young artists and presenting them with exciting prizes!



Fireworks can be fun but take extra care – plan ahead and always follow the firework code.

THE FIREWORK CODE

- Only buy fireworks that have a CE mark, from licenced retailers.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box and use them one at a time.
- Read and follow the instructions on each firework, using a torch if necessary.
- Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves. Keep a bucket of water close by.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five years old.
- Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- Don't let off fireworks after 11pm.
- Always keep pets indoors.

REMEMBER: Wherever possible, attend an organised firework display.

IF YOU ARE HAVING A BONFIRE:

- build the bonfire away from sheds, fences and trees
- never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire
- make sure that the bonfire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.
