Reception admissions for academic year starting in September 2024

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday 6 November 2023**, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is **15 January 2024**.

From 6 November 2023, applications can be made online via <u>www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</u>. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

All of the application information is available on the website above.

Even if a parent already has a sibling at the school, they need to apply if they have a child due to start Reception next September

Parents with Year 2 Children

Year 2- 3 admissions for September 2024

As you are aware, parents of current Year 2 children at an infant school need to make a formal application to the Council for a Year 3 place and can do so via the website <u>www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</u>.

The junior admission round opened on 6 November 2023, for parents of children in Year 2 at an infant school to apply for a junior school (Year 3) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is **15 January 2024**.

Well done for demonstrating our CARE values.



Dear parents and carers,


As advertised in previous newsletters, we will be holding our Autumn Parent Consultation meetings and One Plans next week.

Children will complete 6 challenges (from a list of 12), and it's FREE to take part.

How can my child take part?

Visit your local library to sign up. Your child will:

- Receive their Challenge folder
- Choose 6 challenges to complete (from a list of 12)
- Earn a sticker for each challenge they complete
- When they've complete 6 challenges they will receive a certificate and, whilst stocks last, they will also receive a packet of seeds and a free book from Penguin Books.
- Over the winter we will also be releasing videos about Lyra's journey so keep an eye on our YouTube Channel (<u>Youtube.com/essexlibraries</u>) and social media channels (@EssexLibraries).

Throughout the **winter from 25 November July to 3 February.** Unsure where your closest library is - use the Essex Library Service <u>website</u> to check.


Head to your local library this winter and sign up! You can find out more about the challenge on the <u>library website</u> and if you have any questions, please ask staff in the library.
