Reception admissions for academic year starting in September 2024

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday** 6 November 2023, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.

From 6 November 2023, applications can be made online via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

All of the application information is available on the website above.

Even if a parent already has a sibling at the school, they need to apply if they have a child due to start Reception next September

Parents with Year 2 Children

Year 2- 3 admissions for September 2024

As you are aware, parents of current Year 2 children at an infant school need to make a formal application to the Council for a Year 3 place and can do so via the website www.essex.gov.uk/admissions.

The junior admission round opened on 6 November 2023, for parents of children in Year 2 at an infant school to apply for a junior school (Year 3) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.





Times tables focus for this half term:

Year 3:

Teach multiples of 3. Children need to be fluent in counting in 3s forwards and backwards from any given multiple.

Teach multiples of 4. Children need to be fluent in counting in 4s forwards and backwards from any given multiple.

Year 4:

Recall and consolidate 3s, 4s and 8s.

Teach multiples of 6 and 7. Children need to be fluent in counting in 6s and 7s forwards and backwards from any given multiple.

Year 5 and Year 6:

All times tables.

How you can help with times tables at home:

Encourage your child to practise regularly - chant, write them down, explain the connections and patterns - try to work on the tables your child is working on in school.

Do you struggle to know what to say when your child asks if they can play a game that is too old for them? Is your child already playing such games but you want to know how to have a conversation with your child about it?

Many young people begin their online interaction from a young age, and gaming can make up a large part of this.

As your child gets older, the type of games they want to play may change. We often hear from parents and carers that they are worried about what their child may see, hear or experience in new games, especially if the age rating is older than their child currently is.

Join us as we share practical tips for what to do if your child approaches you asking to play a new game.

UK SIC Suggest you ask the following to get started:: Work out why your child is interested in this game.

Research the game, it's age rating users and user reviews. Make a decision and talk this through with your child.
