#### Reception admissions for academic year starting in September 2024

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday** 6 November 2023, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.

From 6 November 2023, applications can be made online via <a href="www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a>. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

Even if a parent already has a sibling at the school, they need to apply if they have a child due to start Reception next September

#### Parents with Year 2 Children

#### Year 2- 3 admissions for September 2024

As you are aware, parents of current Year 2 children at an infant school need to make a formal application to the Council for a Year 3 place and can do so via the website <a href="https://www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a>.

The junior admission round opened on 6 November 2023, for parents of children in Year 2 at an infant school to apply for a junior school (Year 3) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.





I would also like to thank the Year 5 boys: Harry P, Henry F, Henry M, Archie, Jack, Frankie, Franky, Max and Thomas O




Huge thanks to Mrs. Spilling for giving up her lunchtimes for the last two weeks to train the children.

It is proven that children who read daily are more likely to have accelerated progress.

Children who read books often at age 10 gain higher results at age 16 than those who read less regularly.

Children learn 4,000 to 12,000 words per year through reading.

Reading for 6 minutes a day reduces stress by 68%

Reading enjoyment is reported as more important for children's educational success than their family's socio-economic status.
