Play Leaders

We are excited to announce that we will shortly be recruiting some children to be play leaders for lunchtimes. This is another new role at St. Andrew's and a great opportunity for children of all year groups to be able to help others during break times.

There will be two children from each class chosen to become a play leader. We hope that this will mean that we will be able to run a rota so that the children will be helping every other day. We mentioned the role in Collective Worship a few weeks ago and there seemed to be a lot of interest, so a job application, using a google form, has been created for the children to apply so that we can choose as fairly as possible.

The duties will include:

- Attending meetings about play times and talking about what activities could happen at break.
- Asking children in class for their views about play time.
- · Coming up with suggestions for play activities.
- Organising play activities at lunchtime breaks.
- Organising play equipment and putting this away at the end of breaks.

The application for this important role in school is below in a Google form. The deadline for application will be 15th December 2023.

Please feel free to help your child complete the form. There is also a section for a reference from someone they know to say why they think they would make a good play leader.

Before they apply please make sure that they are happy to commit to the role of play leader and the duties that it involves including the above duties, spending lunchtimes helping out and organising games and initially attending meetings every 2 weeks.

Reception admissions for academic year starting in September 2024

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday** 6 November 2023, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.

From 6 November 2023, applications can be made online via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

All of the application information is available on the website above.

Even if a parent already has a sibling at the school, they need to apply if they have a child due to start Reception next September

Parents with Year 2 Children

Year 2- 3 admissions for September 2024

As you are aware, parents of current Year 2 children at an infant school need to make a formal application to the Council for a Year 3 place and can do so via the website www.essex.gov.uk/admissions.

The junior admission round opened on 6 November 2023, for parents of children in Year 2 at an infant school to apply for a junior school (Year 3) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.

These are the children who have been spotted shining in school this week. We could have chosen so many children- the decisions were hard to make!



This year St Andrew's School Council have pledged to do things differently. We have joined with Eco Essex, a grass roots organisation founded by a group of mums who wanted to do more for the environment, and are encouraging the whole school community - staff included - to cut the number of Christmas cards sent and therefore save trees.

Classes have voted on 3 different alternative ways to still send Christmas cards but without the negative impact on our trees.

The vote was overwhelming and across the school nearly 80% of pupils voted for a Secret Santa Card.
