# An important reminder of our uniform policy in relation to jewellery:-

Jewellery **should not** be worn to school. The exceptions are a watch, which may be worn at the child's own risk, and studs for those children who normally wear earrings. The official instructions from the County Council Safety Officer are that <u>watches and earrings</u> must be removed for games, P.E., and swimming (this includes ear hole retainers and stretchers). Children who cannot remove their earrings cannot do P.E. and as taking part in P.E. is a legal requirement parents must ensure that earrings can be removed or they should not be worn on P.E. days. Teachers cannot be held responsible for the safety of these items.



#### When?


Throughout the winter from **25 November to 3 February.** Unsure where your closest library is - use the Essex Library Service <u>website</u> to check.

### re: Measles

Cases of measles are increasing in England currently. If your child has not been fully vaccinated with the MMR vaccine it is a good time to get this done to protect them. This can be arranged through the child's GP practice. You can check your child is up to date with their MMR vaccinations by looking at their personal health record (Red Book) or by asking their GP.

The early symptoms of measles can look like other illnesses: runny nose; cough; conjunctivitis. The child may also have a high fever. The distinctive rash of measles begins around day 3 of the illness, a rash of flat red or brown blotches appear, beginning on the face, behind the ears and spreading over the body.

Any child thought to have measles should not be sent to school. Where possible NHS 111 or the GP should be phoned for advice, rather than visiting the surgery or A&E.
