#### Reception admissions for academic year starting in September 2024

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday** 6 November 2023, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.

From 6 November 2023, applications can be made online via <a href="https://www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a>. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

All of the application information is available on the website above.

Even if a parent already has a sibling at the school, they need to apply if they have a child due to start Reception next September

#### Parents with Year 2 Children

#### Year 2- 3 admissions for September 2024

As you are aware, parents of current Year 2 children at an infant school need to make a formal application to the Council for a Year 3 place and can do so via the website <a href="https://www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a>.

The junior admission round opened on 6 November 2023, for parents of children in Year 2 at an infant school to apply for a junior school (Year 3) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2024.



These are the children who have been spotted shining in school this week. We could have chosen so many children- the decisions were hard to make!



Children learn 4,000 to 12,000 words per year through reading.

Reading enjoyment is reported as more important for children's educational success than their family's socio-economic status.

During our application for Green Flag status, the School Council of 2022-23 applied for a hedging pack of tree whips from the Woodland Trust. 420 of these tiny little plants, called whips, arrived in October and were healed in by our fantastic volunteer, John Clemo, so they could drink and recover from their journey.

Harry, from the Essex Forest Initiative, brought special tree dibbers which made making the holes in our hard stoney soil, a lot easier.



On Wednesday morning our baby plants were planted along the bottom of our field so they will eventually grow up into a beautiful barrier that will provide valuable wildlife habitat.





32 school councillors and deputy councillors were joined by a fantastic team of volunteers from the local community - parents, Hatfield Peverel wildlife volunteers headed by Wildlife Champion, Donna Goddard and councillor Diane Wallace. We were also privileged to be joined by a team from the Essex Forest Initiative so had the expertise of Harry and his team to ensure we got the whips planted well.



#### How can my child take part?

- · Earn a sticker for each challenge they complete
- When they've complete 6 challenges they will receive a certificate and, whilst stocks last, they will also receive a packet of seeds and a free book from Penguin Books.



#### IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?


