## WHAT DOES RE LOOK LIKE?

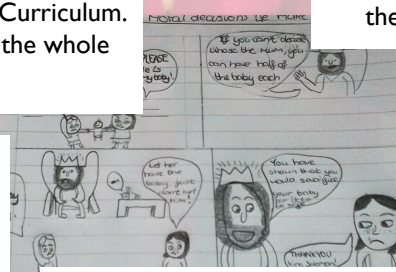
*"You learn about different traditions. You learn more about things you don't know much about - your brain gets fuller."*
